

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

2009 has been an exceptionally successful and gratifying year for all of our students. They have had the opportunity to participate in a wide range of activities across the year. I am always extremely proud of the manner in which our students conduct themselves when away from the school. Whether it be attending leadership days in Grenfell and Bathurst, the Orange Field Days or on the Snow fields in Selwyn, our students demonstrate their exceptional manners and social skills at all times.

Our school performed exceptionally well in the NAPLAN exams earlier in the year. The improvement in Numeracy and Reading placed us at the top of all of the Lachlan School Education Group schools in years 5, 7 and 9. This is an outstanding achievement for these students, their parents and teachers who have worked tirelessly to maximise their learning at QCS. Our task for 2010 is to consolidate these results and work on improving in areas such as writing to ensure our students are prepared for their exams in years 10 and 12.

Sport was again an area of outstanding success for many of our students. The school held its annual swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals, together with the annual Bland Sports event, held in Caragabal in 2009. From these school based carnivals, we had students go through to represent Western Region at the PSSA carnivals in both Athletics and Swimming. We also had success in tennis with one of our primary students representing Western Region at the State Tennis Championships in Sydney.

Our community came to our school for a number of highly successful events this year; with the Meet and Greet in term one being a highlight. Our school community also catered for Education Week, Market Day, a Seniors lunch and a working bee which involved the clean-up and establishment of the school's front garden. This also coincided with a visit by Teacher Education students from the University of Wollongong visiting our school in the "Beyond the Line" program, aimed at encouraging graduating teachers to consider the Western Region as a destination after they graduate from University. We had four students who were very impressed with our school, students, teachers and facilities.

Our staff also participated in a number of Professional Development activities in 2009. The Lachlan CAP (Country Areas Program) initiative involving Dr Rich Allen and the series of network initiatives involving staff from a wide variety of schools proved very popular and has had significant outcomes for our students. The focus was on engaging students in the classroom and explored interactive activities including movement and music. This initiative will be further developed by the CAP Network in 2010.

I will take this opportunity to acknowledge the tireless, and often thankless, work of the teachers, SASS staff, P&C and my executive of Wendy Robinson, Anne Noble and Robin Dowsett. Their support, knowledge and professionalism have been an enormous benefit to the students in our school.

I hope everyone has had as fulfilling a year as myself and wish all a prosperous 2010.

LAKE COWAL ENVIRONMENT CENTRE VISIT

On Monday, 7th September, secondary students set off early with Mrs Pollock, Mr Simpson and Mr Doney for the education centre associated with the Lake Cowal gold mine. Less than 80 km from Quandialla as the crow flies, it is quite surprising that no one has been there before. Perhaps not many people bother to visit Lake Cowal now that it has been dry for some years. The staff were very friendly and informative as they took groups for fieldwork experience in the forested hills beside the centre. The day rocketed by, so that after gobbling down a barbeque lunch we took the bus over to the mine site. The scale is impressive. As we looked down into the hole, dressed in yellow safety vests and hardhats, we learnt that the current depth of 130m will be extended to 300m over the life of the mine and eventually the hole will turn into a very deep lake. Some students left thinking that driving the huge machinery would be a good job.

TERTIARY AWARENESS DAY — FORBES

On Tuesday, 26th May our senior students, Amber, Priscilla and Dannielle travelled to Forbes High School to attend the annual Forbes/Parkes Tertiary Awareness Day. The Students found this day an

invaluable experience, especially the opportunity to talk face-to-face with representatives from the many tertiary institutions represented on the day from across NSW and the ACT.

The students were able to investigate the opportunities and courses offered by a variety of TAFE colleges, universities and career groups. From these presentations, students collected valuable information of personal interest
