STUDENT USE OF MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

It is important to remind parents and students of the responsible use of mobile phones in our school. Our policy clearly states that students, who use electronic devices during class time, without a specific purpose set down by their teacher, can expect to be asked to put it away or have it confiscated by the Principal.

It is also necessary to remind students that contacting people inside or outside of the school for the purpose of inciting or threatening violence can lead to that student's suspension from school. If students are unable to use these devices; such as mobile telephones, in a reasonable and responsible manner it may lead to that student being banned from bringing that device to school.

Once again, I seek your support in ensuring QCS is an environment safe from the risks associated with cyber-bullying and mobile phone misuse.

STUDENT LUNCH PASSES

The provision of student lunch passes is reliant on students doing the right thing whilst they are out of the school. It is essential that students who leave school to get lunch from home only go from the school to home and straight back again. Recently, some students have been going to other places and returning to school late.

Students have a responsibility to return to school on time after going home for lunch. Parents can assist by ensuring lunch is ready when they arrive home and encouraging their child to leave at a suitable time that allows them to arrive back at school by 1.40pm.

If any student were to continually ignore these reasonable directions, it may lead to them having their lunch pass suspended for a set period of time. It is in the best interests of all concerned that our school is presented in a positive way in the community. I anticipate your support in advance in this matter.





QUANDIALLA LIBRARY DEPOSIT STATION NEWS.

A number of traditional favourite authors are represented in this month's book selection including Janet Evanovich, Robert Ludlum, Kathy Reichs, Gerald Seymour, Maeve Binchy, Jodi Picoult, Jonathan Kellerman and E. V. Thompson, but there are a number of interesting new authors too. "The Tenderness of Wolves" by Stef Penney is an award-winner, a mystery set in the Canadian wilderness. Bronwyn Parry is an Australian version of Nora Roberts. Her "As Darkness Falls" has the trademark blend of mystery and romance but in an Outback setting. "Still Alice" by Lisa Genova examines the situation of a woman in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease. And "The Secret Life of Bees" by Sue Monk Kidd has become something of a cult book – slightly eccentric and definitely original

Included in the nonfiction are a couple of biographies and books about the attack on Darwin in 1942, quilt-making, travelling in Australia and Tuscany, the AWB wheat scandal, menopause and a medium who claims to be able to communicate with the dead.

The traditional Summer Reading Club will commence at the library on 16th December. Children between six and fifteen are challenged to read ten books before the end of January. Reading kits will be available from the library from the 16th. And all family historians are advised that there will be a one-day family history research seminar at the Community Hub on 20th February 2010 which will include presentations by State Library Family History Service representatives on what they offer and also using Ancestry.com – more details later

Simulation Clinic opens wide

The Charles Sturt University (CSU) School of Dentistry and Health Sciences has revealed the first completed section of its new multi-million dollar dentistry teaching facilities in Orange. The Simulation Clinic features 60 mannequin heads and state-of-the-art simulation equipment giving each student a practical introduction before working with patients. "Over two days students were inducted into the teaching clinic by CSU Simulation Clinic Manager Mrs Lorraine Wenham and were given an Infection Control Induction by infection control nursing specialist Mrs Sandra Wharton from GWAHS," said senior lecturer Dr Sabrina Manickam.

COUNCIL NEWS 9/11/2009

The public meeting about the hospital last Thursday was very well attended, with 558 names being recorded on the attendance sheets. The concern within the community was evident not only by the presence of so many people, but also by the questions that were asked and statements that were made. All the people who spoke are to be congratulated for the manner they conducted themselves, there was not a wrong thing said all afternoon.

The four motions that were passed by acclamation will enable Council to continue to take up the matter with GWHAS with the confidence that the community is firmly behind us, and will also make GWAHS aware of public sentiment. In the meantime I'm sure we all hope that the optimistic forecast that the matter would be resolved soon, will prove correct.

It was interesting to have Katrina Hodgkinson speak of her difficulties in getting to the Minister for Health. Council has been waiting for a fortnight for a reply to our request for a meeting with the Minister, and it seems Katrina is experiencing the frustration at Ministerial level that the rest of us are feeling at the bureaucratic level. Katrina's effort in attending the public meeting was much appreciated. She had to curtail some earlier activities and drive herself from Oberon to get here in time, but then passed it off as "part of the job" before she left for her home town of Yass that evening. She should be a good judge of a road by now.

As stated by the Mayor at the conclusion of the meeting, Council has commenced a preliminary investigation into suitable premises for a medical centre. The Masonic Temple has been closely inspected but at this stage has been overlooked because of the extensive alterations which would be necessary. Council is now looking at modifying the existing surgery in Weddin Street, which if adopted would mean a replacement residence would be required.

The biggest difficulty with medical centres is predicting whether the doctors, whoever they may be, can work together. Nothing in the health field is every easy.

On more mundane but still important matters, the new tip contractor was scheduled to commence yesterday. Residents will find that some tipping arrangements will change immediately and others will change progressively as we work with the contractor to determine what is best.

The recently introduced opening hours have caused inconvenience to some, but these will be reviewed after six months and it may be possible to identify a better arrangement. However it is unlikely the total hours will increase as this would necessitate an increased payment to the contractor.

The big advantages of the manning of the tip will be the improvements in putrescible waste management, the decrease in wind-blown litter, and the elimination of rubbish from other towns, especially tyres. Simply keeping out the scavengers who used to tear open all the plastic bags in their search for hidden treasure will be a benefit, as this was why much of the litter was unrestrained.

Given time, the improvements will be there to see.

There are also changes in train for the Grenfell Pool, with new opening hours there which will reduce the morning hours when attendance is minimal, and extend the closing time until 7.00 pm. This may impact on family meal times if the kids don't come home when they should, so parents are forewarned.

The new hours have been designed to make the pool more available at the busy times. If you have another suggestion, hand it in (in writing) to the staff and it will be considered.

Council has again agreed to sponsor the Christmas lights competition for Grenfell, and as in previous years this will be judged by the passengers on the Loaders Bus Christmas tour later in December.

Council will also sponsor the village competitions and Quandialla is already off the mark with the annual competition run by Sue and John Priestley of the Quandialla Post Office currently being publicised.

Is it Christmas already?

And don't forget the movies this week. This is one time when booking would be advisable because there's a lot of "Oklahoma" fans out there. Don't leave it too late.
