STUDENT USE OF MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

It is important to remind parents and students of the responsible use of mobile phones in our school. Our policy clearly states that students, who use electronic devices during class time, without a specific purpose set down by their teacher, can expect to be asked to put it away or have it confiscated by the Principal.

It is also necessary to remind students that contacting people inside or outside of the school for the purpose of inciting or threatening violence can lead to that student's suspension from school. If students are unable to use these devices; such as mobile telephones, in a reasonable and responsible manner it may lead to that student being banned from bringing that device to school.

Once again, I seek your support in ensuring QCS is an environment safe from the risks associated with cyber-bullying and mobile phone misuse.

STUDENT LUNCH PASSES

The provision of student lunch passes is reliant on students doing the right thing whilst they are out of the school. It is essential that students who leave school to get lunch from home only go from the school to home and straight back again. Recently, some students have been going to other places and returning to school late.

Students have a responsibility to return to school on time after going home for lunch. Parents can assist by ensuring lunch is ready when they arrive home and encouraging their child to leave at a suitable time that allows them to arrive back at school by 1.40pm.

If any student were to continually ignore these reasonable directions, it may lead to them having their lunch pass suspended for a set period of time. It is in the best interests of all concerned that our school is presented in a positive way in the community. I anticipate your support in advance in this matter.

Examinations at the optometrist, which take about 30 minutes, are free and covered by Medicare.

COUNCIL NEWS 16/11/2009

It's been a week since the public meeting in Taylor Park and still no sign of a settlement. During this time it is known that GWAHS has made several contacts with Dr AlBadran but there seems to be difficulty in getting agreement. Whilst Council has been pressuring GWAHS to take the initiative, it is recognised that both sides in the dispute need to approach the matter in good faith. The one fear that everyone has is that the hospital is closed because there is no doctor to attend.

Council and the Weddin Health Council will now be considering their options.

The new tip managers, David Barratt and Lisa Baker have got off to a good start, putting in quite a bit of extra time to clean up the approaches and tidy up the general area. Their enthusiasm is certainly welcomed by Council.

Many people are still coming to grips with the new opening hours and days, and the changes from the manning may also take a while to get used to. In particular, people should no longer just drive in, they should wait at the "Stop" sign to be directed. The new arrangements are in everyone's best interest, and will help Council meet environmental standards and the requirements of the EPA.

The movie fans of the town are definitely difficult to predict, with only 25 turning up to see "Oklahoma". My mother would have walked to town to see that even if she'd seen it six times before.

Even worse was the response for Saturday's movie of "Angels and Demons" which had to be cancelled when there were no tickets sold by Friday afternoon. The showing charge for these movies is over \$100 and they need a crowd of at least 16 people to break even.

The committee of Bill McSpadden, Mary Moffitt and Glenn Carroll are keen to know what types of movies people want to see so please let them know your preferences.

The gallery committee spent the weekend pulling down one exhibition then setting up the next one which features all local artists.

The Grenfell Art Gallery is going along quite nicely with an exhibition programme available right up until next July. The two mainstays, Joan Bolton and Chris Lobb, are putting in a power of work and time to ensure the exhibitions are top quality, and their success is reflected in the comments from the many out-of-town visitors the gallery receives. They are strongly supported by a growing band of volunteers who give their time to enable the gallery to be open from Tuesday to Saturday every week.

The gallery committee was recently acknowledged by Museums and Galleries NSW, but more of that next week.

The Internet Centre has again printed a range of Christmas cards which are quite attractive and quite economical. Please drop in and ask Joshua to show you the range, you might be pleasantly surprised.

Council's rail consultants are putting the final touches on their report, some of which they have had to modify to accommodate the Federal Government's Grain Freight Review which was only released a few weeks ago. The completion date is now early December.

In the meantime, the NSW Government has canned its proposal to sell off disused railway corridors to developers. This is a victory not only for common sense but also for the many community members and bodies such as the Weddin Shire Council which protested against the idea. It's one thing to have a government with no comprehension of the value of rail, but quite another if it should make decisions which would hamstring a future government.

The State Government is also getting bad publicity over a decision by Ministers Tripodi and Kenneally, to introduce the so-called "Centres" policy which will allow big supermarkets to establish shopping centres whether the community wants them or not. Local IGA businessman Mark Crutcher made the front page of the Sydney press last week in opposing the policy, and lo and behold, Tripodi was gone by Sunday. That's influence for you!

It may be November, but I think summer's here already.

The timing of the new pool hours could not have been better, with Saturday evening being very well patronised. The new pool covers seem to be doing an excellent job, with water temperatures about 5° warmer this year. Of course it could have something to do with the heatwave too.

The November Council meeting will be held this Thursday but it will be a day-time meeting, starting at 8.00 am. As usual, members of the public are welcome to attend.
