Principal's Report:

Student behaviour

Teachers and parents frequently have conversations about children's behavior, and about ways of working together to support children to learn positive behaviours.

In a conversation with a parent yesterday, we discussed a number of points that I think are worth sharing:

- it is important to model and demonstrate positive behavior for children, because young children will learn behaviour from adults
- it is important to teach children about the behaviour that we expect from them. For example, when children are not "behaving well", we need to teach them about the behaviour that is expected
- it is important to teach children to recognise inappropriate behavior, and to make positive choices about their behaviour
- it is important to maintain communication between the home and school, so parents and teachers are working together.

These points are also important in the Positive Behaviour for Learning approach.

Positive Behavior for Learning

The school is planning for the introduction of the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) program in 2011.

PBL is based on research and is proven to significantly reduce the occurrence of problem behaviours in schools. PBL focuses on teaching and developing positive behaviours for all students. Students become more engaged with learning, and their performance improves.

There will be opportunities for parents to participate in the planning of PBL. Information on this will be published in future newsletters.

i.extend

The Western NSW Region *i.xtend* program is an enrichment program designed to cater for the needs of gifted and talented students in Years 5 to 8. It is an online program and its concept has been developed by a committee of teachers, principals, consultants and an academic mentor. The program runs once a year for approximately twelve weeks.

Students are selected for the program via an intensive identification process and are introduced to one another through a one-day face-to-face orientation program. On return to school, students work from the website in their classrooms with their classroom teachers as their guide.

All tasks completed by the students are submitted to, and assessed by, an *i.xtend* team leader. At the conclusion of the twelve-week program, students come together once again to show their work at an expo day.



It's a mixture of new authors and writers from the past in this month's adult fiction selection. There are earlier book titles from P.D. James, Gerald Seymour, Elizabeth Ferrars and Nancy Rosenberg along with new titles from Tony Park, Stephen Leather, Caroline Overington and Diane Chamberlain. "Yarns from all around Australia" is a collection of short stories in traditional Aussie style while "U is for Undertow" continues Sue Grafton's alphabetical crime series. 'X' and 'Z' may challenge her!

The large print features "Dreams from my Father" by Barack Obama which has been very well received here in Grenfell, along with the usual mysteries, romances and sagas. There's "eye-candy" among the nonfiction books with "Wilderness Australia", full of colour illustrations, "Successfully Growing Australian Native Plants" (enjoy looking at the illustrations even if you have no gardening ambitions!), and "The CBUS Collection of Australian Art" which contains 240 pages covering all styles of painting. COUNCIL NEWS 08/11/2010

Council's Mayor Clr Maurice Simpson attended the Police Accountability and Community Team (PACT) meeting at the Boorowa Council Chambers on November 3 and reported that the good news is that the crime rate in Grenfell and surrounding villages remains very low and the position of the Sergeant of Police in Grenfell will be advertised in due course.

However, the crime rate in larger regional towns is much higher which is resulting in an ever increasing reallocation of local Police resources to do duty in these regional towns.

In one sense, we and the State Government are very fortunate that we have a low crime rate and it does make sense that the resources are allocated where they are needed. However, similar to the situation with the doctors the answer appears to be that we need more police trained and allocated to rural and regional areas to assist the police who are doing a tremendous job in very difficult circumstances.

Tenders for the operation of the Grenfell Waste Depot were considered by Council at its October Council meeting with the current operators of the tip Carrion Enterprises being the successful tenderer.

There has certainly been a vast improvement in the tip operations over the last twelve months since Carrion Enterprises have been operating the tip. Prior to the tip being manned one of Councils biggest problems was the dumping of waste and materials such as tyres at the tip from people outside the shire. Their Council most probably already had their tip locked and were charging for this waste disposal. With the tip being manned this problem has now been eradicated.

Carrion Enterprises have a number of proposals they plan to implement to further improve the tip operations and we wish them well in their endeavours.

Councils Director of Engineering Mr Bill Twohill reported to the October Council Meeting that a work order to the value of \$895,797 has been received from the RTA for rehabilitation works on the Newell Highway (SH17). The work is currently in progress and is estimated to take approximately six weeks to complete. This project and the fact we have had a very wet winter will see the need for the Director to allocate his resources in an efficient and cost effective manner to ensure Councils works programme is also completed.

There has been a lot of work go into the accreditation process to receive a work order of this magnitude and full credit to the Engineering Department who have perservered through some tough times to achieve a result like this

In regard to Councils works program Councils slashing crew and gardening staff have been kept very busy with the problem of exhorbitant grass growth emanating from the wet winter. While Councils resources are limited we are certainly doing everything we can to control the growth. Other future works in the program include:

- Maintenance Grading/Gravelling various shire roads prior to harvest
- Linemarking and erection of signs at the recently completed MR398/Holy Camp Road intersection
- Grass slashing
- Erection of a fence around the Vaughan Park playground equipment
- Complete the linemarking and beautification at the Grenfell Railway Station.

The Art Gallery Exhibition "Colour of our Country" is in progress featuring three Sydney Artists – David Milliss, Teri Hiley and Colina Grant as well as various pieces by local sculptors Kathleen McCue and Len Wallace. Similar to previous exhibitions this exhibition is of a very high standard and well worth a visit to the Art Gallery to see.

The film "Robin Hood" was shown at the Grenfell Cinema on Friday 5 November with approximately twenty (20) people attending.
