Recommendation - viability of the secondary school

At the meeting held on Wednesday 30 November, at Quandialla Central School,

Mr Denis Armstrong, School Education Director Lachlan, presented the following information. The consistent decline in secondary enrolments over the period 2004 to 2012 has resulted in the viability of the Secondary school to be questioned.

The Regional Director and the SED Lachlan will advise the Deputy Director General Schools of the concerns about the viability of the Secondary provision at Quandialla Central School. The school will be placed on review for 2012, during which the enrolments will be monitored and reviewed by the Regional Director and SED Lachlan.

Mr Armstrong thanked people for attending the meeting.

Wednesday 30th November was an important date for Quandialla Primary Debaters – it was the day when they travelled to Cowra and defeated Middleton Primary School from Parkes to become the Western Challenge Debating Competition Champions for 2011. This competition is open to all primary departments from Broken Hill to Lithgow, and from West Wyalong to Tamworth. It is truly an outstanding effort that a small Central School should take on the might of the whole Western Region and win!

The team consisted of five debaters: Shea Broomby, Caitlin Dixon, Grace Kelly (all in year 6) and Tiffany Penfold and Britney Troy (year 5). During Term 2, they took part in four debates to be Zone 5 winners, and four more debates to capture the final. All debaters have taken active speaking roles and non-speaking positions as team adviser.

They competed against teams from Grenfell, Forbes, Oberon, Coolah, Tullamore, and Parkes, some on multiple occasions. Because of the great distances between schools, some competitions were held half-way at neutral venues, like Peak Hill and Cowra for the final. Topics varied greatly, from school canteens, TV news, animals in zoos, politicians as role models and the republic debate, to the final, "that all Primary Students should have a Facebook page".

This debate took place on a stormy morning after hours on the road from Parkes and Quandialla. The adjudicator was Mrs Margaret Brown, former Principal of Molong and experienced English teacher. Middleton had the affirmative case, and opened their argument with the team line that life is about communicating with others and Facebook is a gift for all. After a list of its advantages, they proposed a modified, adult-monitored 'junior format' to enable universal safe usage. Shea responded with the social problems of time wasting, lack of real relationships and lack of physical activity, which affected young users.

Their second speaker enlarged on Facebook benefits, safe for children because of their provisions. Britney showed how children could get around restrictions and showed the dangers of bullying and predatory adults in particular. She reinforced that no ease in communication is worth risking the safety of our children. After the affirmative's case summary, Tiffany strongly demonstrated that the positives of Facebook are undermined by the proven dangers to naive and inexperienced users and it is better to experience Facebook when you have more life experience. The adjudicator gave the debate to Quandialla on the strength of their refutes and clarity of argument.

The town and whole region should be very proud of these students and the teachers and parents who assisted them in this wonderful result.

At the Progress Association meeting held on Wednesday, 30th November the issues of policing in Quandialla was raised yet again.

It has come to our attention that we are actually still entitled to have a physical police presence in Quandialla. After the public meeting held on the 14th October 2009, area command agreed that "the officer from Caragabal would be tasked to be in Quandialla township <u>for at least</u> half a day per fortnight to service the policing needs of your community".

Now that a new policewoman has been appointed to Caragabal we would expect this routine to resume. However we should consider what the benefits for our community would be if we had a policeman in residence, especially if we are entitled to have one. One issue relating to this is that the housing section of the police department has condemned the residence in Quandialla. But as was pointed out at the progress Meeting why should Quandialla be without a policeman simply because the department has failed to do appropriate maintenance over the years on the Quandialla residence?

Katrina Hodgkinson who was also present at the public meeting stated that when her party got into government she would do everything possible to ensure that police presence in communities such as ours was increased by providing more finance.

Therefore in light of what we have been told we are suggesting that now is the time for community members to write to Katrina reminding her of her commitment and the Superintendent at area command in Cootamundra questioning, firstly, our entitlement to a police officer in residence at Quandialla and secondly, pointing out the inadequacy of a police presence only half a day per fortnight.

COUNCIL NEWS 7/12/11

Work has commenced on the new doctor's house with preparations for the concrete slab currently underway. Council will be pushing for an early finish were possible, but if the doctor arrives before the house is completed, then temporary accommodation will be arranged for the necessary period.

Renovations of the Burrangong Street surgery are nearing completion with various local tradesmen hard at it. Some services such as air conditioning and computer cabling will be installed shortly, and a proper disabled entry will also be available. Former patients of Dr Varejka will appreciate the many improvements.

Council has been notified that the Federal Department of Health and Ageing has opened another round of infrastructure grants, so Council will again apply for funding for a medical centre. A professional advisory firm has been engaged to help prepare the application and hopefully improve our chances of success.

Of course, should the application be approved, Council will then have to build or buy a second house.

It is understood the Grenfell Citizens Health Action Committee Inc is undergoing changes of personnel. This is an important time for health matters as everyone would be aware. Council is happy to continue to liaise with the committee where appropriate for the overall benefit of the community.

The Federal Government has launched a new initiative through the Department of Health and Ageing, called Rural and Regional Health Australia. This is a service aimed at giving rural people information about health and aged care programs and services in their local area.
