Attendance of students in Term 4, 2011

Students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 11 are required to attend school until the third last day of Term 4 – Friday 16 December 2011.

For students in Year 10, the Board of Studies will issue award documents on 8 December for those students who have met the requirements for the School Certificate.

With the new school leaving age, students in Year 10, who have not reached 17 years of age, are required to attend school until the third last day of Term 4 – Friday 16 December 2011.

Year 10 students who can demonstrate that they are leaving school to enter into full-time permanent employment and will not be resuming their studies at school in 2012 are able to leave school after the award of the School Certificate, provided they have completed all their clearance obligations with the school. In these cases, parents should contact the principal for information.

COUNCIL NEWS 21/9/11

The September Council Meeting began with the annual election of the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and various committee members

Clr Maurice Simpson was re-elected unopposed as Mayor for his thirteenth successive term.

Clr Nevin Hughes was re-elected unopposed as Deputy Mayor for his seventh successive term.

Community representatives were appointed to committees as follows:-

Heritage - Pam Livingstone, John Hetherington, Alan Hodgson Tourism - Lisa Eastaway, John Hetherington, Phillip Diprose

Art Gallery - Chris Lobb, Judy Mitton

Representatives of several local organisations were also appointed to various committees to continue Council's practice of broad consultation with community groups.

Council also considered the matter of how many councillors would be appropriate for the next Council following the 2012 elections. The Minister for Local Government has advised his preparedness to consider applications to vary the number without the need for a formal referendum, provided a prescribed process of public consultation is followed.

Council received a report which identified the number of councillors should be an odd number rather than the present ten councillors, as this usually avoids the need for the Mayor to exercise a casting vote to break deadlocks. Discussion took place on the options of seven or nine councillors before Council finally settled on the latter.

Council's intention will now be advertised for the prescribed 42 days before a final decision is taken at the November Meeting. During this period members of the public may make written submissions which Council is obliged to consider before the decision is made.

The formal announcement by the Area Health Service last week of the Grenfell Doctor was very welcome and was the culmination of many months of negotiations on many fronts. Dr Patrick Akhiwu has now accepted the offer of employment to work in Grenfell and all going well is anticipated to arrive early in the New Year although Council has yet to be notified of a date.

Council's representatives have played a significant role in this process including meetings with Dr Ismael, multiple meetings with the Area Health Service and the local State Member, liaison with the local Federal Member, a meeting with the Parliamentary Secretary for Regional Health at Parliament House, preparation of the advertisement and accompanying incentives, preparation of the application for declaration as a district of workforce shortage, liaison with commercial practice managers and several recruitment agencies, and liaison with suppliers of medical equipment. In addition there was a standalone advertising campaign which very nearly succeeded in obtaining a part-time female doctor.

This activity was over and above Council's financial contribution including the recruitment agency's expenses, the cost of the new house, the surgery upgrading, and the furnishings and equipment required.

Work is now continuing on the necessary preparations for the arrival of the new doctor.

A petition on the doctor's situation was delivered to Council last week for presentation to Thursday night's meeting. Events have largely overtaken the purpose of the petition and Council merely resolved to note it.

A final reminder that the Red Cross Donormobile will be in Grenfell this Thursday at the usual site at Vaughn Park. 131495 is the number.

The annual Grenfell Open Day will be held on Saturday week, which will for the first time be part of the long weekend. In recent years Council has attempted to also conduct a Market Day to benefit local businesses. This year there will be a Goldfest to highlight the connection of the town with the gold rush days, and an interesting programme of activities has been assembled to entertain visitors and locals alike.

The idea of the Goldfest could build to become quite an attraction in time as a second annual celebration (behind the Lawson Festival). Let's hope for good weather and a good crowd.

Speaking of the Lawson Festival, readers may have noticed the recent obituary for Robin Oliver, a Sydney based journalist who specialised in television. For many years Robin was the honorary judge of the Festival's TV awards. Whilst many people questioned the relevance of these awards to the Lawson Festival, they brought a long string of actors, producers and directors to our Awards Nights and gave the Festival invaluable publicity. Sigrid Thornton was one such celebrity who seemed to be received fairly well.

The Festival TV awards have been discontinued in recent years but Robin's contribution should not go unmentioned. He certainly lent credibility to an important section of our awards.

There has been ongoing work over the last couple of off seasons to locate and repair leaks in the plumbing of the Grenfell Pool. So far almost every pipeline has been replaced and it is still losing water (although not as much as last year).

The latest leak seems to be where the scum gutter was added to the side wall of the pool years ago, something which won't be fixed this year. However the work in progress will be completed in time for the official opening of the pool on 10 October.
