TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

LIFE EDUCATION VAN

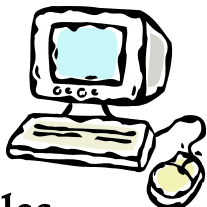

COUNCIL NEWS 17/10/2012

Work on the new doctor's residence is continuing, with paving, grassing and fencing now in hand. The house itself has been completed. Council has negotiated with Dr Akhiwu to furnish the house for an additional rental payment, and this work is being carried out as time permits.

Advice of the doctor's arrival day is being eagerly awaited by all concerned.

The five councils involved in the rail re-opening project will travel to Canberra this week to discuss eligibility for a regional development grant. If successful, these grants can approach ten or fifteen million dollars and would be a great help in enticing a private operator to use their own money for the balance of line restoration costs.

The councils were hoping to meet with the Minister for Regional Development, the Hon Simon Crean, but he has arranged for the group to meet with his senior advisor instead. Never-the-less the meeting is a good step forwards.

The councils are also attempting to meet with the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, the Hon Anthony Albanese, to inform him of the project and hopefully gain some political support. Advice of this meeting is still being awaited.

Preparations are well in hand for the Grenfell Open Day and Goldfest on 27 October. Most people would be familiar with the concept of the Open Day which council has been conducting since 1999, occasionally attracting national publicity and widespread interest from hundreds of potential residents.

The Goldfest is a more recent initiative which draws on early colonial history and is part of a campaign by a number of councils in the Central West and Southern Tablelands to utilise their early days as a tourist attraction. As part of this campaign council has been progressively upgrading O'Brien's Hill for tourists, and of course we still have George St and most of Main Street to show our visitors.

Some aspects of the Goldfest are similar to the Lawson Festival street activities, and these are always well received. It would be nice to draw a similar crowd in time.

The Grenfell Cinema is showing the very highly rated movie, "The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel" this Thursday. The movie is set in India with a group of British retirees taking up residence in what they understand to be a newly restored hotel. Alas, not everything in India is how it appears at first sight.

The movie stars Judy Dench, Bill Nighy and Maggie Smith, and has received very good reviews. It should be a very pleasant way to fill in Thursday afternoon.

The Grenfell Art Gallery has a new exhibition, "The Golden Gift", which features artists Jenny Newbound and Raeleen Pfeiffer. Jenny in particular is no stranger to Grenfell, having judged the Lawson Festival Art Show on several occasions. With this exhibition the Gallery returns to a more conventional format, but there is wide variety of styles and subjects to please discerning art lovers.

Thursday evening sees the October Council Meeting which is the second for the new council. As always, the meeting is open to the public and interested people may sit in and observe proceedings.
