Positive Behaviour for Learning

Throughout 2012, the school has been supported by Helen Wilson in implementing the Positive Behaviour for Learning framework. Helen is the senior PBL coach allocated by Western Region to support the school.

During Week 5, Helen conducted a School Evaluation of PBL at Quandialla Central School. The preliminary findings of the evaluation are very positive. The school will use the evaluation to further refine our PBL framework in 2013.

Parents and Citizens Association meeting

The final meeting of the Quandialla Parents and Citizens Association for 2012 was held at the school on Thursday 1 November. Attendances were down on previous meetings, no doubt due to the increased activity leading up to the harvest period. The main points of discussion included the recent Bland sports carnival; the school canteen returning to one day per week; reports on recent P&C fundraising activities during 2012 and plans for 2013.

Planning for 2013

The school is in the final stages of planning for 2013. Some of the key tasks included in this process are the completion of the annual Evaluation Report; completion of the 2013 School Management Plan; completion of the 2013 finance plan and budgets; completion of staffing and timetable organisation. The Annual School Report (ASR) for 2012 will be completed by the end of December.

Following final approvals, these documents will then be placed on the school website, enabling parents and carers ready access to them.

Remembrance Day Ceremony

Quandialla Central School conducted the annual Remembrance Day ceremony on Monday, at the school. The ceremony was ably led by Tiffany Penfold and Britney Troy, our student leaders, assisted by Theresa Kessey. Guest speaker was Mr Ken McAlister, who spoke on the importance of acknowledging and remembering the contribution by all Australian servicemen and women in all fields since the Great War. Ken also showed two artefacts, commemorative medals, which were presented to the families of local soldiers who served in the Great War. This was a poignant reminder of the very significant contribution that Quandialla district families made to the Great War and the very high casualty rate suffered by families as a result.

A number of parents and grandparents as well as the Weddin pre-school students joined us for the ceremony. The school thanks Ken for his keynote address. Staff and Mr McAlister enjoyed a lovely morning tea after the ceremony.

COUNCIL NEWS 14/11/2012

By now many people would be aware that former mayor Maurice Simpson is in a Canberra Hospital undergoing precautionary tests after feeling unwell last weekend. I'm sure I speak for all in wishing him a speedy recovery.

As a consequence of his absence, Council decided to postpone the Councillor Appreciation Dinner due to be held this Tuesday. A new date will be organised once Mo is fit and well again.

Staff have contacted all the people on the attendance list, so that no-one was caught unawares. Many representatives of surrounding councils were attending in addition to a good roll-up of local people, and hopefully the new date will continue to suit everyone. Any pre-paid funds will be held for the next time and refunded if unable to attend.

The Grenfell Pool is open for business and the water looks clear and inviting, if a little cool.

Council is still being contacted by people concerned about water quality. Whilst there may be occasional problems with the water clarity, the disinfection process is working well and there have been no potential health problems, either this year or last year.

Council is required to carry out regular testing for water quality. Should a substandard test be recorded, the pool manager will take the appropriate steps which may involve closing the pool until the problem is rectified. However this has not occurred in the past and is not anticipated to be a problem this season either.

Christmas is just around the corner and Council has given approval for the Grenfell Association of Churches to again use Taylor Park for the annual Carols in the Park. This is scheduled for Sunday 16 December, from 6.00pm to 10.00pm, weather permitting.

Council has also agreed to sponsor the usual Christmas competitions in Grenfell and the villages.

It will be interesting to see how many households participate in the Christmas lights competition with the rising cost of electricity. It shouldn't be too bad if people control their hours of use and shorten the display period to say, a couple of weeks before Christmas. These displays create a lot of interest and give a lot of pleasure to the community, and it would be a pity not to have them.

A reminder that the annual awards for Australia Day are currently open for nominations. Suitable forms are available from the Council Chambers.

The Mayor and General Manager have attended several meeting of the rail group recently, with the councils agreeing to appoint a consultant to assist with the preparation of an application for Federal funding. If successful, this application has the potential to contribute half the \$30 million cost of restoring the line.

The group has been strongly supported by the Member for Burrinjuck Katrina Hodgkinson, and the councils took the opportunity at last week's CENTROC summit in Bathurst to brief the Member for Bathurst, Paul Toole, and the Member for Orange, Andrew Gee. Both parliamentarians voiced their support of the rail reopening project and congratulated the councils on their initiative.

New Business

- 1. Canteen There has been an increase in no. of days worked by canteen volunteers due to changes in some volunteers commitment. It was recommended by those attending the meeting that canteen be held one day a week, Wednesday, considering the no. of parent volunteers available and ensuring they remain available for canteen. It was also suggested that maybe 'special' lunches be organised a couple of times a term as an alternative to Monday canteen. K Pockley to discuss this with M Kessey before a final decision is made. Canteen will be included on each P and C agenda to ensure that upcoming issues can be discussed.
- 2. Excursion Mrs Robinson reported that the excursion was a success and all students had a wonderful time. The organisation and time put into the excursion by R Dowsett was acknowledged and the support/assistance from parents on the excursion was appreciated. The behaviour incident on the excursion has been reviewed by Mr Foster and the school feels this has been managed appropriately.
- 3. Bland Sports Day K Pockley raised that there is 3 athletics carnivals (before zone etc) each year (coming at a labour cost to school and parents) and questioned the outcomes being met for the students on these days. K Pockley encouraged the review of these days to optimise the opportunity for quality learning outcomes for the students. There is mixed views towards these events from parents and teachers, Mr Foster will discuss this further with the school executive.
- 4. Handball in the playground V Gregory raised the safety of handball and the need for sets of rules to be in place to improve safety when students playing. W Robinson and P Foster explained the measures the school has used in the past to manage handball and the learning experiences gained from the activities. P Foster will not ban handball at this time. He acknowledges the need for variety in the activities for students at lunch time and will continue to encourage student to make good choices.
- 5. Hospitality Catering The Hospitality department recently catered at Bribbaree Bowling Club. This was a successful evening and a good learning experience for students.
