### NAPLAN results

The NAPLAN results packages, which contain the Student Report 2012 for parents, were mailed to each family on Monday 17 September.

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 across NSW sat for the NAPLAN tests in Literacy and Numeracy in May this year.

Parents/carers should note that the NAPLAN tests provide a “snapshot” of a students’ performance at one specific point in time. School based information, including student’s semester reports, feedback from class teachers, and information from parent-teacher interviews, will provide a full understanding of a student’s performance. School based information should be used to put NAPLAN test results into a realistic context.

## **Sale of animals**

All government schools in NSW are required to comply with the DEC Policy on *Animals in Schools*. Quandialla Central School has always complied with this policy. However, we need to refine our practices.

From 21-9-12 (Market Day), there will be **no** sales of animals (chickens, ducklings, or any other animal) to students or children by the school or as part of school endorsed activities. The school will only sell animals directly to parents/carers/adults, via standard processes and the school Office. Sales of animals will be pre-advertised in the school Newsletter. Parents/carers/adults will pay for and collect the animal at the school Office at an agreed time.

Where animals are allocated to students for learning purposes, teachers will contact the parents/carers to arrange a date and time for the parent/carer to collect the animal, and to return the animal to the school.

Please don't hesitate to discuss this with me if you have questions.

## **Money at school**

The only reasons that a student should bring money to school is to pay for their lunch on a Monday or Wednesday<sup>1</sup> (canteen days), or to pay for a school excursion or activity (e.g. school swimming). When paying for an excursion or school activity, students are to take the money to the school Office as soon as they arrive at school.

Students do not need to bring money to school for any other reason. When students bring money to school unnecessarily, problems may arise. Parents and carers are requested to assist the school with this, by ensuring students only bring a small amount of money for Monday and Wednesday lunches, and that when paying for a school activity, the money is placed in a labelled envelope for the student to take to the Office.

## **Debating**

On Friday 14 September, the Primary debating team competed against Eglinton Public School in a round of the Western Challenge debating competition. Eglinton Public School is a very large primary school in Bathurst, and has a large pool of very talented students to draw from.

The Quandialla Central School team debated very strongly, and were challenged by the experienced and capable Eglinton PS team. Unfortunately, in an extremely close debate, our team was defeated by the Eglinton PS team.

However, I don't view this as a defeat. I view it as a commendable achievement for our team to have progressed to this level in the competition. The adjudicators provided both teams with important feedback, and this will inform our preparations for the 2013 competition. Interestingly, the adjudicators stated that the Quandialla team has the ability to successfully debate a team from any high school.

According to the adjudicators, the only point of difference between the Eglinton and Quandialla teams was that Quandialla introduced a new argument late in the debate. Our team considered it was introducing further evidence to support the argument.

Again, congratulations to our team members Tiffany, Britney, Sarah and Emma. A great effort, with true Quandialla sportsmanship. I also wish to thank our parents who travelled to Bathurst to be part of the audience and to support our team.

## **Positive Behaviour for Learning – responding to inappropriate behaviour**

Quandialla Central School is a Positive Behaviour for Learning school. Our core values are Respectful, Responsible and Learner.

Occasionally, students make poor choices and teachers intervene to support the student to manage their behaviour. In these circumstances, the PBL *Consequences for Inappropriate Behaviour* are applied. Go to the school website to see the PBL information sheet in this.

There are three steps in this –

1. A discussion with the teacher to resolve the matter
2. If the misbehaviour is persistent or continues, then referral to the Assistant Principal or Head Teacher, and parents are contacted
3. If the matter is serious, or the misbehaviour continues, then referral to the Principal.

The three step approach is to encourage students to learn and to make appropriate changes. It is not designed to “punish” students. Learning changes behaviour, while punishment may not.

The PBL School Award lunch will be held on Wednesday 19 September, for all students K – 11. Lunch will be a hotdog, ice cream and popper drink. Lunch will be at 1.00pm. But, don't forget to pack your children's munch/crunch and recess food.

The competition to name our echidna PBL mascot closes this week. The echidna is on display in the school office. The competition is open to all students, and will be judged by an independent person. I am hoping the name will reflect the school and town identity.

## **School uniform**

From the beginning of Term 4, students should wear their summer uniform. All students are expected to wear full school uniform each day.

## **School Assembly and Market Day**

Market Day will begin at approximately 11.00am, and finish up at 2.00pm. The pack up and clean-up will start promptly at 2.00pm and students may then go home with parents at 2.30pm. Students who live in town may walk home, with permission from parents/carers.

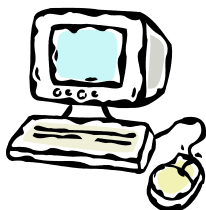

## **COUNCIL NEWS 19/9/2012**

The successful councillors were finally announced last Thursday, with four from the last council and five new members. It shapes up as a pretty good council. In fact, I thought I heard a collective sigh of relief resound right around the shire when the outcome was known.

With three members of the former 10 member council not standing, there were automatically two vacancies in the new 9 member council. However another 3 lost their positions to make room for additional new members.

It is interesting to ponder whether a turnover of this magnitude would have occurred under the old ward ( or riding) system. The vote in the referendum four years ago which spelled the end of the wards, was clearly a deliberate statement from the community to improve the democratic process.

The election website isn't the easiest to use, but there are some interesting tables once you do get in there.

You can follow the sequence of when candidates were elected or excluded. It is probably not unexpected with so many candidates, but it took 18 counts before the final picture emerged.

Voter turnout for Weddin was 2497 which is 90% of the total enrolment, with 3.4% informal. These figures compare reasonably well with adjoining councils, (Bland, 83%, 3.0%; Cowra 83%, 5.2%; Forbes 86%, 2.8%; Young 86%, 4.3% respectively). The low informal vote confirms that electors wanted their votes to count.

The new council has some interesting attributes. For the first time ever, it contains two women, Clrs Carly Brown and Jan Parlett, who are the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> females to serve on council.

It also contains three rural men, Clrs John Niven, Graeme Halls and Alan Griffiths, as well as Clr Nevin Hughes who has only recently moved to town. The biggest concern in the referendum was that the rural areas may not be properly represented, but this fear seems to have been allayed: the proportion is about right.

There are also four business people in the council. Many candidates identified the need to attract new business so the council should be well placed to do this.

The first meeting of the new council will take place at 5.00pm this Thursday, and the first matter to consider will be the appointment of the new mayor. With long standing Mayor Maurice Simpson stepping down, there could be a few hats thrown in the ring, both for mayor and deputy mayor. There will also be a need to appoint at least one new delegate to Central Tablelands Water. The first half hour could be somewhat absorbing.

For someone who's only been to Grenfell once, Dr Akhiwu was frequently a topic of conversation during the election campaign. In fact some candidates took some very curious stands on the important issue of health.

There is no question that the process of replacing Dr Varejka has taken much longer than anyone envisaged or wanted. However Dr Akhiwu seems particularly well suited to Grenfell's needs, and hopefully the wait will be well worth it. Having two doctors practicing in town again will be reassuring for everyone.

Council has been informed that Dr Al Badran has gone away for a couple of weeks at short notice. It is understood his practice will resume next week.

Another who has gone away is Council's Director Environmental Services, Shane Wilson, who has resigned as of this Thursday. Arrangements have been made for part-time assistance with building and planning matters from Cowra Shire, however it will not be possible to attend to matters in this department as speedily as they have been in the past. Please be prepared for the unavoidable delays.

The NSW Government has introduced a scheme of offering metropolitan residents \$200 discount accommodation vouchers to encourage them to get over the sandstone curtain and travel out west. No doubt the extra visitors will be very welcome wherever they choose to stay, but I suspect city dwellers will head towards the bigger regional centres where they can get a McDonalds and a cappuccino any time of the night or day.

Some years ago this council, as part of CENTROC, supported a campaign to get reduced business taxation in rural areas of need. It is a system which has worked successfully in parts of the USA and Europe in bringing employment to marginal areas, helping the local economy and revitalising the rural area. Unfortunately the scheme was not taken up by government despite its obvious benefits. It would have been a long way in front of some token accommodation scheme.

The annual Grenfell Open Day is scheduled for Saturday 27 October, which is Council's major campaign to attract new business and new residents. It has been quite successful since its very modest beginnings in 1999, with some years being better than others.

Once again the Grenfell Goldfest will be held on the same day. The two concurrent promotions seem to work quite well together, and provide attractions for locals and visitors alike. Perhaps we can use the Government's new scheme to our benefit.

The Bald Archy Exhibition is now open to the public with a small entry charge to help offset the costs of transporting all the works to Grenfell. With the assistance of the Gallery volunteers, this exhibition is open 7 days a week up until 6 October.

It is a must see exhibition for everyone with an interest in current affairs, and many people judge it more enjoyable than the Archibalds themselves. Be sure to call in at the Grenfell Art Gallery and see for yourself.

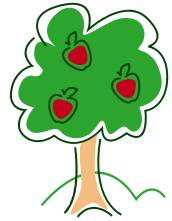
