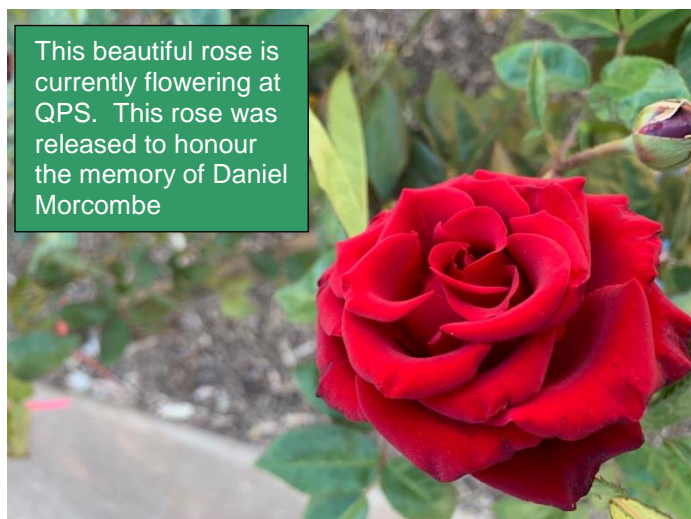

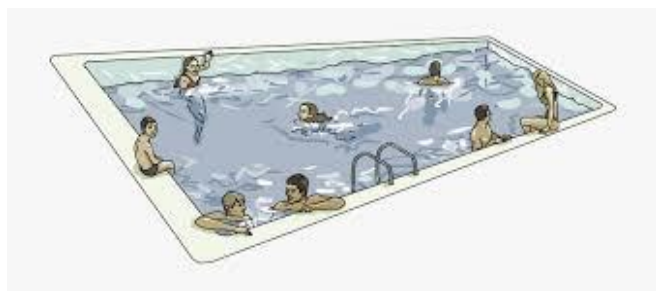
The Quandialla Swimming pool will be opening

Stories from Story Box and BorrowBox count as well.

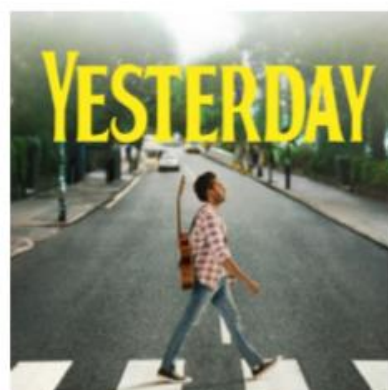
An investment of one book a day, three to four minutes is all that is necessary to open a child's mind to a lifelong love of books and learning.

# TO ALL QUANDIALLA RESIDENTS DO YOU OWN A DOG?

The Weddin Shire Council would like to take this opportunity to remind the public of their responsibilities under the **Companion Animals Act 1998** in relation to owning or being in charge of a dog.

Please be advised of the following offences:

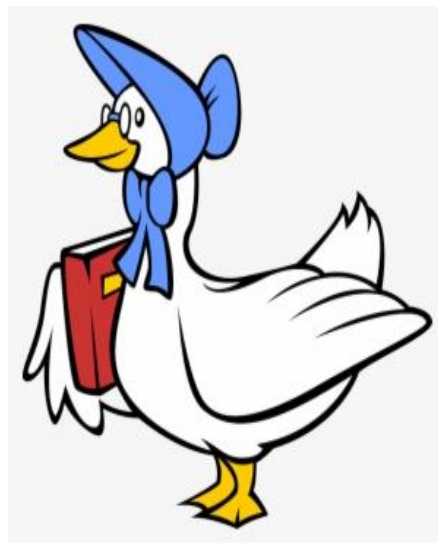
- *Owner not prevent dog from escaping* which may attract a penalty of **\$220.00**
- *Own dog/be in charge of dog not under effective control in public place* which may attract a penalty of **\$330.00**
- *Dog not wear collar and name tag* which may attract a penalty of **\$180.00**
- *Own/be in charge of dog which rushes at/attacks/bites/harasses/chases any person/animal* which may attract a penalty of **\$1,320.00**

Breaches of legislative requirements may enable Council taking any appropriate action which may include but is not limited to impounding your dog.

Please always have your dog under effective control by means of a collar and leash whilst in a public place. If you have any questions or wish to discuss this matter further please do not hesitate to contact Council Ranger on 0427 246 787
