WEDDIN SHIRE COUNCIL**STRONGER COUNTRY COMMUNITIES
FUND (SCCF) ROUND THREE**

Round Three of the NSW Government's SCCF is now open and will provide an additional \$100 million for community projects in regional NSW.

In 2019 there will be an increased focus on young people aged 12-24 and a broader scope of eligible projects including programs as well as local infrastructure.

Funding will be allocated to projects that clearly demonstrate community support for projects and align with the program objectives. The funding available for projects in the Weddin Shire is \$766,618.


